
### Writing Drama in ItCU.

It has been said that some of the interactions that I have written for several Of the leads in HCU is tantamount to dialoguing for jerks. I have to say that Crafting scripts for a story that you must temper the encounters, whatever The encounters. You don't want all the same thing on every page. If conflict Is the main course then you temper it with humor. If you are writing tragedy, Pepper it with irony. For comedy, you have to salt it with pain. It is within These positive-negative relationship parallel encounters that we all can Identify with. Mankind is ultimately defined by its suffering.

Within literature, drama or conflict keeps the reader suspended within the Tale. HCU is no different. In fact, utilizing established public domain persona From mythology, I have been able to use previous national attitudes as well To embellish the story. Historically speaking in such literary works as The Illiad & The Odessy, we read about Herakles' exploits as well as labors as a Prominent position in Greece and Rome. In Sharazade's Arabian Nights, we Have travelled with Sinbad across the seven seas. His reputation for being Amorous with the ladies along his journeys is well established. Shakespeare Penned Caesar and Cleopatra at the beginning of her rise to power, which She attributed to her patron goddess Isis. Isis like Cleopatra has always Allied herself with powerful males. In HCU it is no different. So I took those Elements of history and combined them with modern locales and dialogue. I Gave Isis a burning love interest in the powerful Herakles only to have it Tampered with by the womanizer Sinbad. What I have done is extend their ancient drama into our modern era. The drama presented to the readers of HCU is by far nothing new. That is my point. History always repeats itself. Jealous lovers causing wars as greed envelops the heroes causing them to act immorally. Pride pulls against morality. Its just a continuation of what was started thousands of years ago for your reading escapism. Otherwise it would be just boring.
